We help each other learn so that everyone experiences success every day. Success means doing new things, learning new skills, finding new ways of thinking and solving interesting, complex and challenging problems.





B2 NSS in English and Greek



Reading the story in both English and Greek, allowed our students not only to expand their vocabulary but also to explore the themes of collections, love and a range of emotions.





The photos below show one of the activities B5 were engaged in to celebrate the beautiful story.




STEM CHALLENGE


