Its lovely to have the warmer weather and the days grow longer, our students are enjoying spending more time outdoors, enjoying the sunshine and playing in the fresh air. From soccer games to running around with friends, it's wonderful to see the children so active and happy during these warmer months!

Hydration is Key!

With the warmer weather, it's easy to become dehydrated, especially when playing sports or running around. Please remind your child to drink plenty of water throughout the day. We encourage all students to bring their own water bottles, and we have water fountains available for refills when needed.

Lost Property

As the school gets busier with outdoor activities, we've noticed an increase in lost items—hats, jackets, and sports gear, to name a few. To help reduce the number of lost items, please ensure that all belongings are clearly labelled with your child's name. If your child loses something, they can check the Lost and Found area, and we encourage you to remind them to check regularly.

Soccer and Sports Safety

With soccer season in full swing, it's great to see so many children enjoying a friendly game. However, as with any physical activity, it's important to play safely. Students should always wear appropriate footwear and be mindful of others to avoid accidents. We also ask that they play with respect for their teammates and opponents and use the equipment properly.

Support from Yard Duty Teachers

If your child needs help or has any concerns while outside, remind them that yard duty teachers are always available to assist. Whether it's resolving a problem,

needing a first aid kit, or simply finding a missing item, the yard duty teachers are here to help and ensure everyone has a positive experience during recess and lunch breaks.

many were attempting for the first time. Teaching staff at camp were very impressed and proud of the resilience students showed and the way in which they all encouraged and supported each during adventure


activities.








Update

- 2. Provide you with your unique \$400 School Saving Bonus code by the end of November.




