

SPECIALIST - TERM 2 OUTLINE

ITALIAN

This term, students in **Wattle 2** will be extending their knowledge of the Italian language by learning how to respond to classroom instructions in Italian. They will be exploring simple gestures that add emphasis to expressions when speaking Italian. Students will be learning how to count to 10 and explore stories and songs in Italian. They will be developing an understand of the significance of the Italian Republic Day in Italy.

This term, students in **Wattle 7 and Wattle 8** will be exploring the days, months and seasons of the year in Italian. They will be comparing when seasons take place in Italy and Australia, recognising the differences between the Northern and Southern hemispheres. Students will be learning how to describe and respond to questions about the weather in Italian and continue to explore the Italian language through stories and songs.

This term, students in **Wattle 5** will be exploring their routines at home in Italian, focussing on specific times of the day. They will be asking and answering questions about their routines in Italian, with their peers. Students will be exploring the names of the objects they use at home and their purposes and further extend their understanding of the Italian language to describe their location using positional language.

This term, students in **Wattle 3 and Wattle 4** will be revising their knowledge of the names of body parts in Italian. They will be exploring clothing items and recognise when they are worn, based on the weather. Students will be exploring Italian fashion designers and how these labels have had an impact in Australia and across the world over time.

STEAM

This term, students in **Banksia 2, Banksia 3 and Wattle 2** will be learning about using devices responsibly and the importance of keeping their personal information safe. They will also be introduced to basic coding and problem solving patterns using our Bee Bots and Blue Bots.


This term, students in **Banksia 8, Banksia 9, Wattle 7 and Wattle 8** will be learning about what is real and what is fake when online. They will also test their building and designing skills using our Lego Spike Education Kits. Students will be designing and programming different parts of an Amazing Amusement Park.

This term, students in **Banksia 2, Banksia 4, Banksia 5 and Wattle 5** will be learning about making good choices online by considering how their actions could impact others. They will explore the Osmo devices as a tool to learn literacy, numeracy and problem solving skills. Students have expressed interest in having more science experiments this term and we will aim to do this in the last few weeks of term.

This term, students in **Banksia 6, Banksia 7, Wattle 3 and Wattle 4** will be learning about the impacts of spending time online, communicating and gaming with others. They will also begin planning their projects for the Young ICT Explorers competition. Students will use the Engineering Design Process to develop a solution to a local, community or global problem.

SPECIALIST - TERM 2 OUTLINE

PE

This term, students in **Banksia 2, Banksia 3, Banksia 8, Banksia 9, Wattle 2, Wattle 7 & Wattle 8** will continue participating in PMP (perceptual motor program) sessions every Monday. These sessions will develop students' fundamental movement skills, and will incorporate catching, throwing and ball kicking skills. Throughout the term, students will also practise different ball striking skills, which will be incorporated into many different games & activities. Towards the end of the term, students will participate in our gymnastics program, which will culminate in our very popular Ninja Warrior obstacle course.

This term, students in **Banksia 1, Banksia 4, Banksia 5, & Wattle 5** will continue participating in 3/4 sport on Wednesday afternoons. They will learn to play, and learn rules, for different sports and rotate though these sports each week. During PE lessons, students will be learning skills to be able to play net games such as Volleyball, Table Tennis & Badminton. Later in the term, students will participate in our school gymnastics program, where they will be introduced to different jumping, landing, rolling & balancing skills. This program will culminate with our very popular Ninja Warrior obstacle course.

This term, many of our students in **Banksia 6, Banksia 7, Wattle 3 & Wattle 4** will be playing Interschool sports on Friday mornings against other schools in our district. Sports played this term include soccer, netball & volleyball. During PE lessons, students will further develop their sports specific skills to be able to play net games such as, volleyball, badminton & table tennis. They will develop their understanding of court awareness and develop and practise the different skills required to be successful playing these games. Later in the term, students will participate in our school gymnastics program, where they will continue to develop their jumping, landing, rolling & balancing skills. This program will culminate with our very popular Ninja Warrior obstacle course.

VISUAL ARTS

Students in **Banksia 2, Banksia 3, Banksia 8, Banksia 9, Wattle 2, Wattle 7 and Wattle 8** will continue to learn about primary and secondary colours and experiment by mixing paints. They will learn about applying texture to their artwork, using techniques such as smudging pastel lines and adding sand to create collages.

Students in **Banksia 1, Banksia 4, Banksia 5 and Wattle 5** are building upon their knowledge of the colour wheel by creating tertiary colours, including how colours change when mixed with white. They will learn about the Aboriginal artist Jimmy Pike and use his artwork as inspiration to create their own piece of Aboriginal art.

Students in **Banksia 6, Banksia 7, Wattle 3 and Wattle 4** will conduct research about the famous Aboriginal artist Albert Namatjira, particularly about his contribution to Australian art. They will use examples of his work as inspiration to create paintings depicting Australian landscapes.
