


## Parent Opinion Survey - We Value Your Voice

This is not about withholding information — it is about protecting the privacy, dignity, and rights of all individuals involved, especially our students. Some matters are considered confidential by law, and we are guided by privacy legislation in what we can and cannot share.

As Principals, we are trained well, and we always seek guidance and advice where needed to ensure we are responding appropriately, and to make informed decisions in the best interests of our school community.

We are committed to being open and transparent <u>where possible</u>. At the same time, I ask for your understanding that not all information can be made public particularly if it involves sensitive issues.
