


Parents and carers will also have the opportunity to learn more about our school, the Prep program,

NUMERACY IN WATTLE 3

this term the students in Wattle 3 have been learning about multiplication and division. This week they have been learning about the volume of shapes. They have been calculating volume by using the length, width and height and also by counting centicubes. In one session, students made shapes for their table partner and had to calculate the volume of an irregular shape.









Being a Greek News Reporter: Weather Forecast Video in Greek

A couple weeks ago Banksia 6 learned how to be a Greek news reporter. First, we watched videos to see how to be a Greek news reporter and we learned new vocabulary in Greek. Then, we researched the weather in three places in Greece. We took notes and then rewrote it as a script. We went into a room and got a map and a pointer. We were now ready to record in Greek. Some students helped others record and rewrite their scripts on the whiteboard, so that they could read the script while they were recording. After we finished recording, the class gathered around the T.V. to watch our videos. Everybody loved each other's videos. Now the students in Banksia 6 know how to be a Greek news reporter. This was such a fun learning experience. This definitely helped us improve our Greek fluency and vocabulary.

Tectonic Plates Informative Text

My class and I learned about tectonic plates. We watched videos about them, wrote texts about them, read articles about them and learned about their movements because they can cause volcanic eruptions and volcanoes. Tectonic plates are huge irregular shaped slabs of the earth's lithosphere that are constantly moving. Tectonic plates are the reasons for natural disasters such as earthquakes, tsunamis and at times form mountains. This all happens due to the movement of the tectonic plates. The Santorini volcano erupted over 1000 years ago and formed the islands of the Aegean Sea. The volcano eruption was caused by the tectonic plates. With our classmates, we drew and made 3D diagrams about tectonic plates, tsunamis and volcanoes.

Με τους συμμαθητές μας ζωγραφίσαμε και φτιάξαμε 3D διαγράμματα για τις τεκτονικές πλάκες, το τσουνάμι, το ηφαίστειο κ.ά.
