

Teaching Respectful Relationships at LNPS

At Lalor North Primary School, the wellbeing of our students is at the heart of everything we do. As part of our Respectful Relationships curriculum, we are proud to teach age-appropriate lessons that help students understand:

- The importance of respecting themselves and others
- How to build positive friendships and healthy peer relationships
- How to express emotions in safe, respectful ways
- Understanding of fairness, inclusion, and empathy
- Gender norms and stereotypes helping students identify and challenge unfair or limiting ideas (e.g., "only boys can play sport" or "girls aren't good at maths")
- Respectful relationships between boys and girls in their classroom promoting equality, consent, and kindness in friendships
- Personal identity and acceptance and supporting students to feel safe to be themselves.

These topics are aligned with the **Victorian Curriculum** and are taught with care, cultural sensitivity, and always in partnership with our community values.

If you have questions about what is taught or would like to view the curriculum, please don't hesitate to contact your child's teacher or speak with our Wellbeing Team. We welcome open conversations and aim to keep families informed every step of the way.

Together, we are continuing to build a safe, respectful, and inclusive school for every student.



Mobile Phones in Schools



This is a friendly reminder that all students bringing a mobile phone or smart watch to school must sign this in at the school office each day. This is in line with mobile phone policy and guidance introduced by the Victorian Government in 2020. Students are not to store mobile phones or other devices in their bags and are not to use these devices across the day. Any contact you need to make with your child across the school day can be directed through our friendly administration team by calling 9465 4922. Once mobile phones are presented at the office, these are stored securely.

CHANGES TO DIGITAL DEVICE USE

From 2027, the Victorian Government is introducing changes to the use of digital devices for students from Prep to Grade 6.

Under the new guidelines, schools will no longer invite families to purchase or bring their own digital devices to use at school for Prep to Grade 6 will follow new recommended digital device times, including minimal device time for Prep to Grade 2; and a maximum of 90 minutes per day for grades 3 to 6.

These changes are intended to support families by reducing costof-living pressures. They will also support students by reducing screen-time which can reduce the risk of eye strain, sedentary behaviour, and reduced peer interaction. These reforms



complement Victoria's nation-leading mobile phone restrictions, ensuring an integrated approach to addressing digital distraction and the inappropriate use of technology.

As you know, we already provide school-owned digital devices for student learning, so there is no impact on our school's programs. Students with disability who use a digital device as a reasonable adjustment are exempt from these changes.

I am please to confirm we already meet the new guidelines as a school and there will be no changes to what we are currently doing at Lalor North Primary School.

If you have a concern, we encourage you to share it so we can work together to find a positive solution. This process outlines the steps for raising a concern. Working together is key to resolving concerns quickly. PLAN - WHAT IS YOUR CONCERN ABOUT? the classroom or playground... your childs learning and/or progress... Step 1 safety... an incident.. inclusion and wellbeing. SEE THE CLASSROOM TEACHER FIRST Your childs' teacher may solve the problem quickly. Ring the office to make a time to meet with the teacher. Step 2 It's important to work together to resolve the concern. Most concerns raised are resolved with the classroom teacher. If the concern is not resolved or requires a higher level of leadership it may be necessary to see a School Leader or an Assistant Principal. SEE THE SCHOOL LEADER OR ASSISTANT PRINCIPAL Step 3 Book a time at the office to meet with a School Leader

or make a time to see the Area Assistant Principal.

SEE THE PRINCIPAL

Step 4

Book a time at the office to see the Principal. Very few concerns require a meeting with the principal.

Working together is the key to resolving all concerns raised.


Life Education

Safe parking around schools starts with you

School zones are for safety, not shortcuts. Every parked car, every driving decision, every moment of attention counts.

Let's keep our kids safe.



Park further away on nearby streets and walk the rest: avoid crowding the school gate.



Keep the front of the school clear: for emergency vehicles, buses, and safe crossings.



Never stop in no-stopping or bus zones: even "just for a minute."



Avoid double parking: it blocks visibility and endangers kids.



Plan ahead for drop-offs and pick-ups: arrive a few minutes early or later to avoid the rush.



Use designated drop-off zones properly: quick goodbyes, then move on to keep traffic flowing.



Be alert and patient: children can be unpredictable around traffic. It's about our children's safety and our community's values.
