We have many languages, come from many backgrounds and are a school of many differences, but we speak with one voice, as one school.

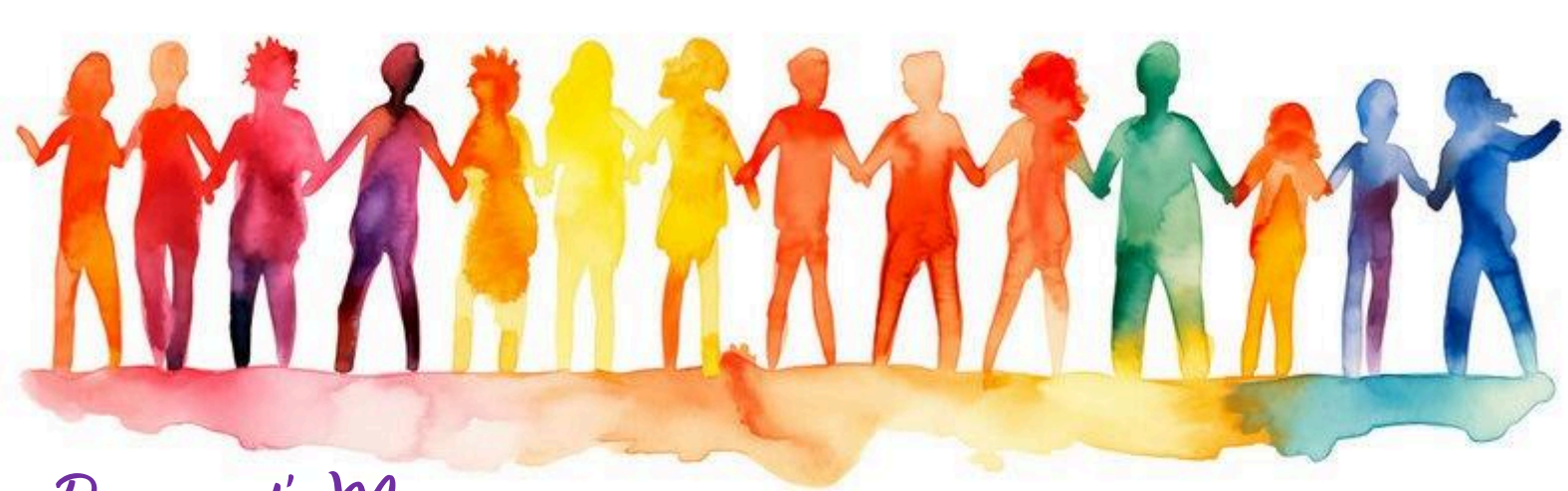
We develop a sense of connection and belonging within each part of our school, and across the whole school.

Morning Routines

It's been wonderful to see such enthusiasm from students about coming to school. In fact, some students are arriving very early due to their excitement to start the day.

Students who arrive **before 8.30am** must be enrolled in TheirCare or be supervised directly by a parent or carer. The same applies after **3.45pm**, when any students not collected are asked to report to the office.



We ask all families to register online with TheirCare (theircare.com.au) or call 1300 072 410. Registration is free, and even if you never plan to use the service, it provides peace of mind for those unexpected moments, traffic delays, or last-minute changes, allowing you to easily enrol your child in after school care without added stress.

Routines at home can help....

Strong routines at home can support children as they settle into school life and help create a sense of predictability and security. The connection between home and school partnerships by working cohesively together really support our students to experience success.

**Consistent sleep routines*

Regular bedtimes and wake-up times support emotional regulation, concentration, and energy levels across the school day. Where possible, keeping sleep routines similar on school days and weekends can help children feel more settled.

**Clear morning routines*

Predictable morning steps (such as getting dressed, eating breakfast, and packing bags) reduce stress and support independence. Visual reminders or checklists can be helpful for some children.

**Regular check-ins*

Short, intentional conversations – for example, asking what went well during the day or what they're looking forward to tomorrow – support emotional awareness and connection. Keep it positive!

**Moments of connection*

Shared time, even in small amounts, helps children feel valued and supported. This might look like talking on the way to school, sharing a meal, or a calm moment before bedtime.

**Modelling calm strategies*

Children learn how to respond to stress by observing adults. Modelling strategies such as deep breathing, taking pauses, or naming emotions supports children to develop their own coping skills.

Annual Privacy Reminder for our School Community

Our school collects and uses student and parent personal information for standard school functions or where permitted by law, as stated in the Schools' privacy policy and the Schools' privacy collection notice.

Our Photographing, Filming and Recording Students policy is on our school website. This policy describes how we collect and use photographs, video and recordings of

students. The policy also explains when parent consent is required and how it can be provided and withdrawn.

We ask parents to also review the guidance we provide on how we use Google Workspace for Education safely at the school and what parents can do to further protect their child's information. If after reviewing the guidance, you have any questions or concerns regarding your child using Google Workspace for Education, please contact the school.

Student Accident Insurance/Ambulance Cover Arrangements

Families are reminded that the Department of Education does not provide personal accident insurance or ambulance cover for students. Parents and carers of students who do not have student accident insurance/ambulance cover are responsible for paying the cost of medical treatment for injured students, including the cost of ambulance attendance/transport and any other transport costs. You can purchase insurance policies from commercial insurers.



We'd also like to remind families and staff that the Department does not hold insurance for personal property brought to schools and it has no capacity to pay for any loss or damage to such property.



Sun Safety – Reminder for Hats and Sunscreen

From mid-August to the end of April, UV levels are often high during the school day. Too much sun exposure can damage children's skin and eyes and increase the risk of skin cancer later in life, even on cloudy days.

To help keep students safe, please ensure your child comes to school with a sun-protective hat (bucket, broad-brimmed or legionnaire) and SPF50+ sunscreen applied before school. Students are encouraged to use shaded areas when outdoors, and children without an appropriate hat will be asked to play or work in the shade. The school provides sunscreen and reminds students to apply it during the day. Thank you for supporting sun safety at school. Please read the school policy on our website.

MOBILE PHONE POLICY



We would like to remind everyone of our school's mobile phone policy, which is designed to support a positive and focused learning environment for all students. As part of this policy, all student mobile phones must be handed in to the front office at the beginning of the school day. Phones will be securely stored and returned to students at the end of the day.

This policy is in place to minimise distractions during class time and help students stay focused on their learning. Mobile phones can easily disrupt lessons and reduce opportunities for meaningful engagement with teachers and peers. By keeping phones out of classrooms, we aim to foster better concentration, face-to-face interaction, and overall academic success. We appreciate the support of parents and carers in reinforcing this message at home and encouraging students to follow the guidelines each day. Free health, wellbeing and development checks for prep students

The Primary School Nursing Program is a free health and wellbeing service offered to all Victorian students in their first year of school. The program aims to assist with the early identification of children with potential health, wellbeing or development concerns which may impact on their education and offers screening which may include:

- Hearing
- Vision
- Speech
- Dental
- Motor skills
- Behaviour and social skills

The Primary School Nurse also provides advice, information and referrals to other health and support services.

This week, Prep students brought home an envelope containing information about the Victorian Primary School Nursing Program. This program is a free health assessment service provided by the Department of Education and Training and is offered to all children in their first year of primary school. The assessments will take place onsite at Lalor North Primary School, and the program aims to see all Prep students. The school nurse will assess vision, hearing and dental health.

Families can support their child's participation by completing the online School Entrant Health Questionnaire.

Thank you to the families who have already completed the questionnaire for their prep child. If you haven't yet had the chance, please use the QR code included in the information sent home to access the questionnaire. It can be completed online using a mobile phone, computer or tablet.

If you would prefer to complete a paper copy of the questionnaire, please contact the school office.

NAPLAN

NAPLAN 2026 will be held from **Wednesday 11 March to Monday 23 March** for our students in **Years 3 and 5**.

NAPLAN helps schools, teachers and education systems understand how students are progressing in key learning areas, such as reading, writing, language skills and numeracy. It provides a snapshot of student learning at a point in time and helps teachers identify strengths and areas where extra support may be needed. NAPLAN results also help schools review their teaching programs and ensure they are meeting students' learning needs, while giving parents information about their child's progress in relation to national standards.

During this time, students will complete assessments in reading, writing, language conventions (spelling, grammar and punctuation), and numeracy. The writing test will take place on the first day only (Wednesday 11 March), with all other tests scheduled across the remaining days. Catch-up sessions will be available, if needed during this period.

Practice sessions and assistance with the computer skills have begun to help students feel prepared and are continuing this term. Families are asked to avoid extended absences during this period, unless the absence is related to illness. Specific dates and details will be provided closer to the time. If you have any questions or concerns about NAPLAN, please don't hesitate to contact the Assistant Principal (3-6), who will be happy to support you and provide further information.

Our Process for

Raising a Concern – Follow the Steps !

At Lalor North Primary School, we value open communication and strong partnerships with our families. To make it easier for parents and carers to raise any concerns, we've introduced a new simplified process that clearly outlines each step to follow.

This process is designed to ensure that all concerns are handled promptly, respectfully, and with transparency, so families know exactly who to contact and what to expect at each stage.

We will be using this process immediately and supporting our families to following our new consistent streamlined process.

LALOR NORTH PRIMARY SCHOOL

RAISING A CONCERN STEPS

At Lalor North Primary School, we value open and respectful communication. If you have a concern, we encourage you to share it so we can work together to find a positive solution. This process outlines the steps for raising a concern. Working together is key to resolving concerns quickly.

Step 1

PLAN – WHAT IS YOUR CONCERN ABOUT?

the classroom or playground...
your child's learning and/or progress...
safety...
an incident...
inclusion and wellbeing...

Step 2

SEE THE CLASSROOM TEACHER FIRST

Your child's teacher may solve the problem quickly. Ring the office to make a time to meet with the teacher.

It's important to work together to resolve the concern.

Most concerns raised are resolved with the classroom teacher. If the concern is not resolved or requires a higher level of leadership it may be necessary to see a School Leader or an Assistant Principal.

Step 3

SEE THE SCHOOL LEADER OR ASSISTANT PRINCIPAL

Book a time at the office to meet with a School Leader (Learnings Specialist, Leading Teacher or Wellbeing Leader) or make a time to see the Area Assistant Principal.

Step 4

SEE THE PRINCIPAL

Book a time at the office to see the Principal. Very few concerns require a meeting with the principal.

Working together is the key to resolving all concerns raised.

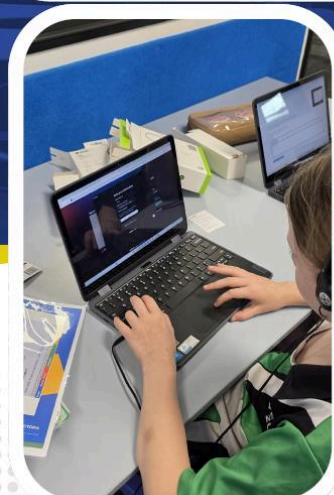

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

INFORMATION FOR FAMILIES

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's financial circumstances and their outcomes.

CAMPS, SPORTS and EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors. Excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works while sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are a part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school excursions, camps and sporting activities. If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or support an out of home care student you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid directly to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

HOW TO APPLY

New applicants should contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form or download from the website below.

If you applied for CSEF at your child's school last year, you do not need to complete an application form this year unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

You only need to complete an application form if any of the following changes have occurred:

- **new student enrolments:** your child has started or changed schools this year.
- **changed family circumstances:** such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing this year.

Check with the school office if you are unsure.

Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund eligibility

Applications must be submitted to the school as soon as possible and no later than the end of Term 2.

Where a school or family is unsure if the concession card is eligible, they are encouraged to submit the application into the CSEF system for validation.

CSEF payments cannot be claimed retrospectively for prior years.

Queries relating to CSEF eligibility and payments should be directed to the school.

Those who are eligible to apply for the CSEF must meet both of the following two criteria or be eligible for special consideration.

Eligible means-tested cards

Only financially means-tested cards are eligible.

Eligibility date

Eligibility will be subject to the parent/carer's concession card being successfully validated with Centrelink (refer to the department's policy, [Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund \(CSEF\)](#)), on either the first student day of Term 1 or Term 2.

Criterion 1 – General eligibility

The applicant must be one of the following:

- a parent or carer who is the beneficiary of a financially means-tested card
- a student over 16 years who is considered a mature minor and holds a valid concession card (such as a Youth Allowance Health Care Card). Applicant to use the 16 and over application form. For guidance on assessing whether a student is a mature minor, refer to the department's policy on [Mature Minors and Decision Making](#)
- a parent or carer whose child is 16 or over and the beneficiary of a financially means-tested card but are not considered a mature minor. Applicant to use the 16 and over parent consent form.

For students over 16 years of age and where the eligible card is in the name of the student, the fund is only granted to that student, not their siblings.

Criterion 2 – Be of school age and attend a Victorian school

For the purposes of CSEF, students may be eligible for assistance if they attend a registered Victorian school.

CSEF is not payable to a student attending pre-school, kindergarten, TAFE or who are home schooled.

Special Consideration

A special consideration eligibility category exists to assist families and students in certain circumstances. Applications should be made through this application form. For more information, refer to: [Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund \(CSEF\): Eligibility](#).

Payment amounts

The CSEF is an annual payment paid directly to the school and will be allocated by the school towards camps, sports and/or excursion costs for your child. Please refer to the department's policy for the current rates and more information, [Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund \(CSEF\): Payment amounts](#).

How to complete the application form

Note: all sections must be completed by the applicant.

1. Complete the APPLICANT DETAILS section.
Make sure that the Surname, First Name, and Customer Reference Number (CRN) details match those on your concession card. You will also need to provide your concession card to the school.
2. Complete the STUDENT DETAILS section for students at this school.
3. Sign and date the form and return it to the school office as soon as possible and no later than the end of Term 2. [Privacy Statement](#)

The Department of Education is committed to protecting your privacy. All information collected will be handled in accordance with the Privacy Data and Protection Act 2014 (Vic) and the Health Records Act 2001 (Vic). This personal information is collected to assess your eligibility to receive a CSEF payment. Your data is securely managed and only shared with Centrelink and DFFH when necessary for business operations or legal compliance. By submitting this form, you consent to our data practices.
