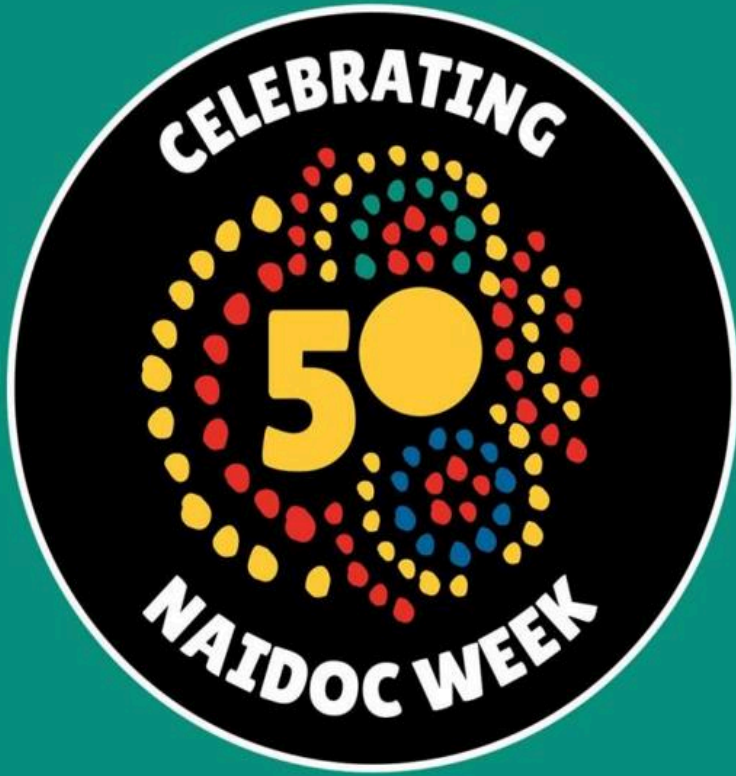

As we approach the end of Term 2, 2026, it is timely to reflect on the theme for the upcoming 2026 National Aborigines and Islanders Day Observance Committee (NAIDOC), '50 Years of Deadly'.

NAIDOC Week will occur during the school holidays, from Sunday 5 to Sunday 12 July 2026, making the final weeks of June the perfect time for reflection. This year's theme celebrates 5 decades of NAIDOC Week – of celebrating the voices and cultures of First Nations communities. This theme is about reflecting on past achievements, while celebrating the momentum that continues to drive sustainable change – grounded in culture and identity.

Families can support learning by:

- Reading together daily, whether it's novels, magazines, recipes, comics, or information books.
- Talking about what you read, encouraging children to explain, predict, and make connections.
- Visiting local libraries, museums, parks, or community events to build knowledge and vocabulary.
- Encouraging children to keep a holiday journal, write postcards, create stories, or record memorable experiences.
- Involving children in authentic writing tasks such as shopping lists, meal planning, instructions, or family messages.
- Playing word games, board games, and engaging in conversations that develop language and thinking.

The most important ingredient is enjoyment. Reading, writing, talking, and exploring together help children maintain their learning while creating lasting family memories.

We encourage all families to take advantage of the many everyday opportunities to nurture curiosity, language, and a love of learning throughout the break.

Traffic Safety Around Lalor North Primary School

The safety of our students is a shared responsibility. We ask all families and community members to help keep our children safe during drop-off and pick-up times.

Please remember that school zone speed limits of 40 km/h apply during designated times and all parking signs must be strictly followed. To reduce congestion around the school, consider parking a short distance away and walking to the school gate.

When using school crossings, always stop for pedestrians and wait until the crossing is completely clear before proceeding. Children should be encouraged to use designated crossings, hold an adult's hand when near traffic, and practise the "Stop, Look, Listen and Think" approach when crossing roads.

By working together and modelling safe road behaviours, we can ensure that all students arrive at and leave school safely each day.

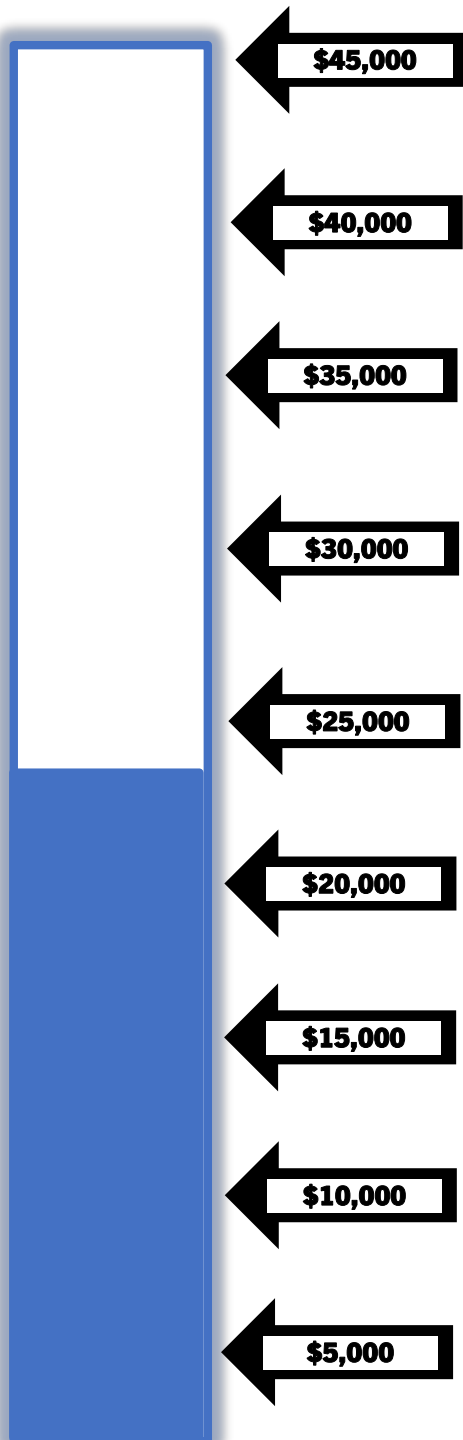

All students were fully entertained, laughing and cheering throughout the show!



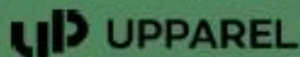

What Happens to the Textiles?

Little Angler Kits for Grade 5 Students

The Victorian Government is committed to increasing the number and diversity of people fishing and enjoying Victoria's local seafood, growing healthy and sustainable fisheries sectors and contributing to Victoria's social and economic prosperity. This is why the Victorian Government distributed 95,000 Little Angler kits to primary aged students in 2023/24, via the Victorian Fisheries Authority, as part of a \$1.5M election commitment, funded via the sale of Victorian recreational fishing licences, i.e. funded by recreational fishers.



The aim of this election commitment was to continue to grow recreational fishing participation in Victoria, by actively encouraging primary school aged children to learn more about the art of fishing, marine life and the natural environment. Encouraging children to be outside and active aligns with whole of Victorian Government initiatives underway to optimise health, wellbeing, connectedness and inclusiveness in Victoria.

Following the successful implementation of the commitment, the Victorian Government will run the program again in 2026, via the Victorian Fisheries Authority, offering 82,500 Little Angler kits to primary school children in 2026.

The FREE kits provide a wonderful school holiday activity for children with their families and help ease the cost of living, providing a fun activity close to home.

Grade 5 students at all Victorian schools, including ours, will be offered the opportunity to receive a FREE Little Angler Kit. Grade 5 students have been selected based on the Victorian Curriculum focus, movement and motor development, and safety considerations.

The program is entirely voluntary. Schools were provided with the option to opt out of the program. Our school has opted to stay in the program so that parents can decide whether they want their child(ren) to receive a fishing kit.

Opt out

Parents of Grade 5 students can advise the school if they do not wish their child(ren) to participate for any reason whatsoever. We support parents in making decisions that align with their family values and beliefs.

Receiving kits

The roll out of kits will occur in August 2026 so that all participating children will have a kit in time for the September school holidays.

The kits include a rod, reel with line, tackle tray, some tackle (including fishing hooks and lead-free sinkers) and information on how to use them to catch a fish. The tackle tray will be wrapped in cardboard and placed inside a pocket inside the fishing kit bag, which will be sealed with a cable tie to discourage students from opening their kits until they are with a parent or carer. The kits will also have a safety label attached to the outside of the kit bag, recommending that students wait to open the kits until they are under the care and supervision of an adult.

Kits will be handed out to students to take home with them as soon as the school receives them. Teachers will tell students not to open the kits until they are safely at home with a parent or carer, however parents can contact the school and request to collect their kit from the school themselves if they prefer.

RAISING A CONCERN STEPS

At Lalor North Primary School, we value open and respectful communication. If you have a concern, we encourage you to share it so we can work together to find a positive solution. This process outlines the steps for raising a concern. Working together is key to resolving concerns quickly.

Step 1 **PLAN – WHAT IS YOUR CONCERN ABOUT?**
the classroom or playground...
your child's learning and/or progress...
safety...
an incident...
inclusion and wellbeing...

Step 2 **SEE THE CLASSROOM TEACHER FIRST**
Your child's teacher may solve the problem quickly.
Ring the office to make a time to meet with the teacher.
It's important to work together to resolve the concern.

Most concerns raised are resolved with the classroom teacher.
If the concern is not resolved or requires a higher level of leadership it may be necessary to see a School Leader or an Assistant Principal.

Step 3 **SEE THE SCHOOL LEADER OR ASSISTANT PRINCIPAL**
Book a time at the office to meet with a School Leader (Learnings Specialist, Leading Teacher or Wellbeing Leader) or make a time to see the Area Assistant Principal.

Step 4 **SEE THE PRINCIPAL**
Book a time at the office to see the Principal.
Very few concerns require a meeting with the principal.
Working together is the key to resolving all concerns raised.

We value open communication and encourage families to reach out if they have a concern or complaint.

If you would like to speak with your child's teacher, please contact the school office to arrange a suitable time. This may be a scheduled meeting or a return phone call, depending on availability. This helps ensure that teachers can give your concern the time and attention it deserves. Please note that teachers often have meetings or appointments after school and may not always be available to speak at length at short notice.

Alternatively, you can email the school at lalor.north.ps@education.vic.gov.au with your message for a classroom teacher. The office will ensure your communication is passed on promptly.
