## Unity

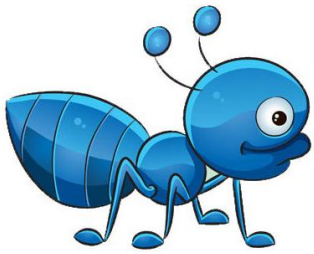

# MINI BEASTS INCURSION

## PREP - 2



Last Friday, students in Grades Prep - 2 participated in a fun Science incursion, where they explored the world of mini beasts and made connections to the living world around us.

Children were very excited to have hands on experience with living creatures, such as caterpillars, crickets, worms, yabbies and stick insects. They also took on the role of scientist when using equipment such as microscopes and magnifying glasses and were surrounded by butterflies inside the butterfly tent!



We hope that our students have developed further curiosity about living things in our environment and that they will be inspired to make the right choices to protect and conserve nature in the future.





# INQUIRY EARLY YEARS

On Wednesday the 26th of July, students in Prep- 2 welcomed three employees from Bunnings to help us with a seed planting experience.

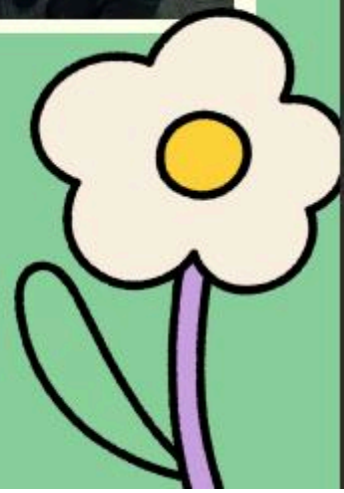


This experience connects to our Science Inquiry Unit, 'Living Things', where we will continue to observe and record changes in our seeds using our 'growing a plant' journal.

The students used cotton wool to wrap up a variety of seeds and then placed them in clear zip lock bags. We then created 'little sprout' houses with paper and attached them to the windows of our classrooms. We will need to keep spraying our seeds with water daily and hope to see some sprouting in the next 4-5 days.

# Science Week

## INSPIRE ROBOTICS INCURSION

During our STEM lessons on Monday - Wednesday of Science Week we are very excited to be welcoming the people from Inspire Robotics to Lalor North Primary School.

They will be running a 1 hour session with each class to show some of their amazing science creations.

### Activities

**Rooms 1, 4, 5, 7, 8, 13 & 14 - The Floor is Lava**  
Engineering and building a structure to protect as many of their little plastic toys from the lava filled floor as possible.

**Rooms 6, 10 & 11 - Rocket Dragsters**  
An exciting introduction into aerodynamics, where kids get to design and construct their own rocket-powered dragsters to then launch and see aerodynamics at play!

**Rooms 2, 3 & 9 - Bottle Rockets**  
Designing and constructing rockets out of Gatorade bottles and cardboard, to then launch into the sky using a spectacular chemical reaction between bicarb soda and citric acid inside the rockets!

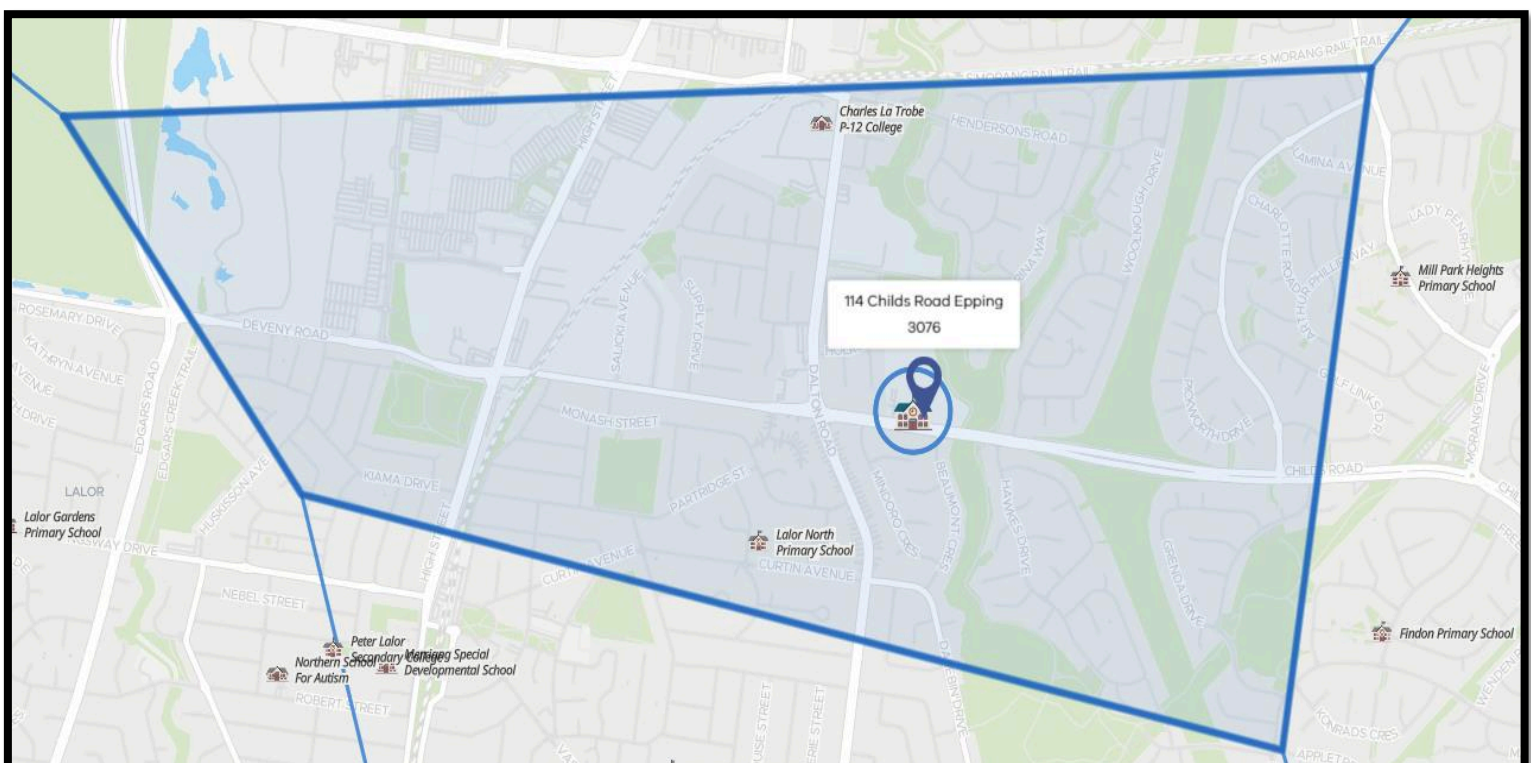

# Sunscreen



The sun's ultraviolet radiation (UV) can cause skin and eye damage and skin cancer. You can't see or feel UV. It can be scattered and reflected so can reach you even in the shade. Whatever the weather, when the UV is 3 and above, use all five forms of sun protection.

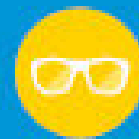

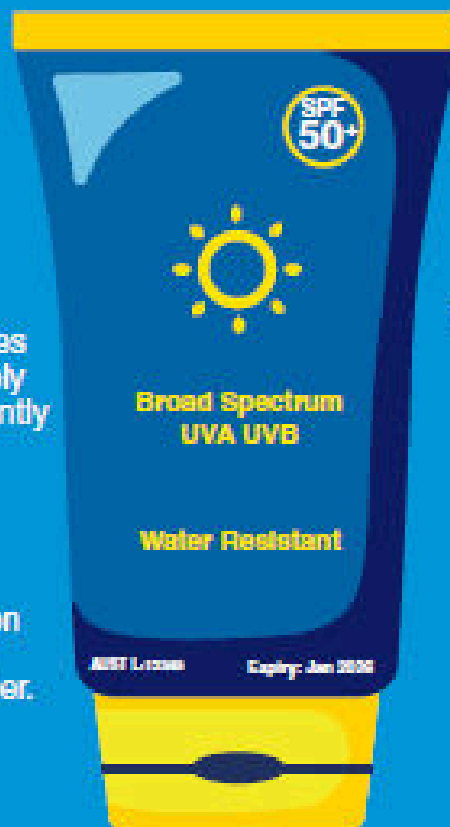
## Application

Apply a generous amount of sunscreen to any skin not protected by clothing.

Apply sunscreen about 20 minutes before going outdoors and reapply every TWO hours or more frequently if sweating or in water.

## AUST L

In Australia, sunscreens are regulated by the Australian Therapeutic Goods Administration (TGA). Always check for the AUST L (Australia Licence) number.



## Water Resistant

Four hours water resistance does not equal four hours UV protection. Always reapply after swimming.

## Storage

To help keep sunscreen stable, store it below 30 degrees.

## Expiry

Always check the date to make sure the sunscreen hasn't expired.

## Broad Spectrum

Protects against UVA and UVB radiation.

Even when wearing a hat, apply sunscreen to help protect from scattered and reflected UV reaching the face, neck and ears.

DNA damage that causes skin cancer accumulates with repeated UV exposure. Apply sunscreen daily.

What's been happening?

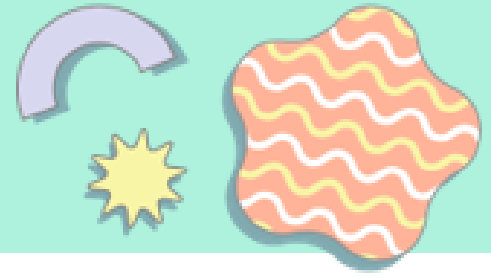
