### Victorian Curriculum F-10 Mathematics Version 2.0

The revisions to the Victorian Curriculum F–10 Mathematics are based on feedback from Victorian educators, including through the formal monitoring the VCAA has conducted over the past 4 years, the significant consultation conducted by the Australian Curriculum, Assessment and Reporting Authority (ACARA) in reviewing the Australian Curriculum Foundation to Year 10, and advice provided by Curriculum Area Reference Panels, made up of Victorian teachers from across school sectors.

The revised Victorian Curriculum F-10 Mathematics Version 2.0 will give Victoria's students the best opportunity to thrive in a world of increasing change and rapid technological advancement. Mathematics Version 2.0 reflects the expertise and feedback of teachers to make the new curriculum more streamlined for them to understand, plan, teach and assess student learning.

## Science Week Inspire Robotics













This week our students celebrated Science Week by inviting the scientists and engineers from Inspire Robotics to visit each classroom during their STEM lesson.

Students were thrilled to attempt a range of hands-on engineering challenges that taught them about aerodynamics, atoms, building strong structures, lift and drag.

The students from Year Prep to Year 2 designed and built structures using a range of materials. We learnt that engineers use triangles when they want a structure to be strong because triangles are the strongest shape. Our structures were very impressive and some were even able to hold the weight of 5 large dictionaries.

In the older years, students learnt about aerodynamics. We discussed the design of planes and rockets and how we can use 'nose cones' to reduce drag and wings to create lift. Students added fins and wings to their bottle rockets to make them fly as high as possible. We launched the rockets on the oval and the basketball courts and had some very impressive results.

Overall the students had an amazing time and it was a great way to celebrate Science Week.














