## Unity



## Parent Teacher Interviews

Parent teacher interviews are a valuable and important part of our assessment and reporting cycle every year. In 2023, our Parent Teacher Interviews are in Term 1 and 3 and written student reports are provided at the end of Term 2 and 4.



**Bookings will soon open** on Compass for Parent Teacher interviews on Thursday the 14<sup>th</sup> of September with fifteen-minute timeslots available between 11.15am and 8pm. **Bookings will close** on Tuesday 12<sup>th</sup> of September at 8.30am. Interpreters can be booked for many different languages, so please indicate if you need an interpreter. If your language is not listed, please contact the office on 9465 4922, so we can attempt to locate an interpreter for you.

**Please note: Thursday the 14th of September is not a regular school day. Students do not attend school but come with their parent/s for their interview only.**

Interviews will be conducted face to face at school in your child's classroom at the allocated time, so please go directly to your child's room. Specialist interviews will be in the main building, so please come to the office for directions.

Grade 1/2N in Room 5 will have their interviews in Term 4 on Thursday the 5th of October. A separate booking sheet will be made available to parents with students in Grade 1/2N. Interviews for Italian and Grade 2KG Music will not be available that day but can be arranged through the office in Term 4, if needed.

Optional Interviews are available with your child's specialist teacher, as you may need to discuss concerns or progress. Because Specialist teachers may teach over 300 students at the school, they will not be available to meet with all parents on this night. Each Specialist will have only 30 interview timeslots available to the first families to make a booking.

The staff of Lalor North Primary School thank you for your support and we look forward to building connections with families at this important opportunity to give feedback on student learning in Term 3.

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### No smoking/vaping



Parents, carers, schools, and community all play an important role in protecting children and young people from, and educating them about, the harmful effects smoking and vaping.

Research from the Royal Children's Hospital shows many parents and carers are not aware of the harmful effects or how their views about smoking and vaping can impact the likelihood of a young person taking up smoking or vaping.

Teachers worked together to select appropriate topics for their cohorts to participate in, as Life Ed offers a variety of topics that are suitable for different year levels. This ensured topic content was not already covered and the content matched the curriculum requirements for each class.

Harold was a huge hit when he visited our Assembly on Friday the 25<sup>th</sup> August and the valuable learning shared with students will support them as they grow to become young adults.



## Our topics this year are.....

### My Body Matters

Harold and his friends want to look their best for photo day at school, but discover that things don't always go to plan. This module focuses on things students can do to keep themselves healthy including:

- the importance of personal hygiene
- choosing foods for a healthy balanced diet
- benefits of physical activity and sleep

### Ready Steady Go!

Harold and his friends are ready for their big race at the school athletics carnival... or are they? When one member of their relay team doesn't show up, what will they do? This fun, engaging narrative provides students the opportunities to discover:

- benefits of physical activity
- safety strategies in different environments
- how our body reacts in new situations
- what our body needs to be healthy including a nutritious diet, water and sleep

### Be cyberwise

This module focuses on cybersafety, cyber ethics and building positive relationships with friends online and offline. The students explore how technology and the online world can be positive, but also the risks that can be involved. Students will build a range of strategies to stay safe online around:

- responsible and respectful behaviour when using communication technology
- keeping personal information safe online
- safe/unsafe people to engage with online
- ways to manage bullying and cyberbullying
- how to report inappropriate behaviour and how to get support

### Decisions

This module offers a choice of content on legal drugs or legal and illegal drugs and encourages students to make informed and positive decisions for themselves. Students explore the decision-making process and improve decision making skills by looking at choices, consequences, responsibilities, facts, and influences. Students will explore:

- what drugs are and how they are classified
- the effects of drugs on the body
- influences on decision making – family, peers, media, culture, financial, legal
- misinformation surrounding drugs and how accurate information supports decision making
- strategies to manage peer pressure and skills to be safe

## SCHOOL SMOKING AND VAPING BAN


By law, smoking and vaping are banned within the grounds of, and within four metres of an entrance to, all childcare centres, kindergartens, preschools and schools.

### WHERE THE BAN APPLIES

The smoking and vaping ban applies to:

- anyone present on school premises during and outside of school hours including students, teachers, contractors, parents or carers or the wider community, such as sporting groups
- all activities that take place on school premises including pre-schools, kindergartens, outside school hours care, cultural, sporting or recreational activities and school fetes

Smoking and vaping are also banned within four metres of any part of a pedestrian access point (entrance) to the premises.



The diagram adjacent shows an example of where the smoking ban applies at a school.

### WHEN THE BAN APPLIES

The smoking and vaping ban applies at all times, no matter whether the building or school grounds are being used for education purposes or other purposes. The ban therefore applies when other activities are taking place on the school grounds, such as fetes or sporting events, as well as during school hours.

### WHY THE BAN EXISTS

#### To protect children and young people from the dangers of second-hand smoke and vapour

This ban ensures that children and young people can enter and leave these areas without being exposed to harmful second-hand smoke and vapour. Their health is particularly at risk because they have smaller airways and less developed immune systems compared to adults.

#### To reduce the role modelling of smoking and vaping behaviours around children and young people

Children and young people are more likely to view smoking and vaping as socially acceptable when they regularly see people doing it.

Banning smoking and vaping in areas used by children and young people will discourage children and young people from using tobacco or e-cigarette products.

### DEFINING A PEDESTRIAN ACCESS POINT

A pedestrian access point in relation to premises means a door or gate by which a person can enter or exit the premises. It does not include an emergency exit that is locked to entry.

It does include shared doors or gates. For example, where a building is occupied by a childcare centre as well as other organisations, such as private businesses, any shared entrances that are used to access both areas of the building would be subject to the smoking ban.

Any entrances which lead only to premises not included in the smoking ban, such as the private offices, would not be subject to the smoking ban.

### WHAT PENALTIES APPLY

Fines are described under law in penalty units. From 1 July 2020 to 30 June 2021, a penalty unit is valued at \$165.22.

The penalty for breaking school smoking and vaping ban laws is a court fine of a maximum of five penalty units (\$826 as of 1 July 2020) or an infringement fine of one penalty unit (\$165 as of 1 July 2020).

The value of a penalty unit is set annually by the Department of Treasury and Finance and is updated on 1 July each year. 


