

Principal's Message

Dear Families,

We finally have warmer and more consistent weather conditions! Our children are enjoying their outside play and opportunities to bring the learning into our beautiful outside spaces.

As the weeks are quickly slipping by, we are getting closer to the end of the school year. All of our planning for our new classes and grade structures is well under way and teachers are beginning to finalise the reports in preparation for families.

Our school has had many enrolments in the last couple of weeks and we have increased our overall numbers by 10% for the beginning of next year. Its great to hear the positive feedback from all new families who are excited to be attending our school in the new year.

Play Equipment

Our annual playground inspection has identified that our one of our playgrounds needs some minor maintenance and we are hoping to complete this as soon as possible. We are currently not able to use it until we ensure that the maintenance is completed. Our children love that playground and are all looking forward to being able to use it again. Playground inspections are an important part of our processes to ensure we have a safe environment for all of our school community.

Parent payment

We have distributed the parent payments for 2024 to all families. This year we have made it easier for all families so that they can make payments at the office and the supplies will arrive at the school in individual boxes. This decision was made based on the feedback gathered from parents and teachers.



The contributions families have provided have especially made a huge difference to the special curriculum opportunities that we would otherwise not be able to offer. These financial contributions have assisted us to include enhanced digital learning experiences, offer STEM as a subject and resource it well, purchase further books and resources, celebrate concerts and special events, improve our classroom and school environment as well as enrich teaching to include our Kitchen Garden and Sustainability learning experiences. Your contributions have also enabled us to make excursions and incursions more affordable throughout the year as well.

Canteen

Our Canteen will be outsourced next year, and we will have new arrangements in place. After many years of having a canteen at Lalor North Primary School we have now reached the time to move to a new provider. This was a very difficult decision to make, and our school council have been discussing this for several years. More information will be provided in 2024.

Unfortunately, just like most schools it has been increasingly more difficult to run the canteen due to increases in product prices and gaining the stock that is required due to shortages by the suppliers. As a small school our canteen was incurring increasing losses over several years which we are no longer able to sustain. Elizabeth Ketkas will remain with us at Lalor North Primary School as a valued member of our staff.



Over the course of the year the Student Representative Council (SRC) meets together once a week with the purpose of giving the students of Lalor North Primary School a voice in matters that affect our students.

The representatives were selected by their peers from the classes with students in grades 3-6 and each of these representatives was paired with a class from grades Prep to grade 2. to ensure all students were included in having their voice heard.

The SRC meetings are held once a week for 30 minutes during the student's eating time and lunchtime. The representatives are free to bring along any discussion points that they feel are relevant for school improvement and the discussion during these meetings are respectful, open and student-led.

Some of the key improvements led by the SRC during 2023 include:

- the creation of class suggestion boxes, as a way to hear the needs of all students
- the development of lunchtime clubs, as voted on by the student population
- creating a school schedule and system for cleaning the yard daily
 reading over necessary school policies
- developing a school vegetable garden area
- gathering student opinions on the new school uniform
- planning fundraising events for 2024

The SRC representatives communicate the relevant decisions and progress of our meetings back to their classrooms as well as the classrooms that they are paired with.

The enthusiasm, care and responsiveness of the representatives this year has been exceptional and has ensured that every effort to have student input on relevant issues has been considered.


What's been going on in Room 14?
