Dear Families

First and foremost, thank you to the families that have made a huge effort to work with us to improve our students arriving to school by 9am. There has already been an improvement being noticed by the teachers reporting the improved settled classroom routines. We will continue to be monitoring attendance and lateness throughout the year.

Attendance

Our school review in 2023 identified attendance as an important area to improve at Lalor North Primary School.

Going to school every day is the single most important part of your child's education. Students learn new things at school every day and missing school puts them behind.

If students miss school regularly, they miss out on learning the fundamental skills that will set them up for success in the later years of school. Each day a student misses puts them behind and can affect their educational outcomes. Each missed day is associated with progressively lower achievement in numeracy, writing and reading.

Attendance patterns are established early, so a child regularly missing days in kindergarten or in the early years of school will often continue to miss classes in the later years and receive lower test scores than their classmates.

It's vital that students go to school every day, even in the early years of primary school. Please assist your child to attend school everyday unless they are sick and try to organise medical appointments outside of school hours. Unfortunately, being away from school for one day a fortnight equals missing 1.5 years over 13 years of school, so you can see the impact on learning that poor attendance can have.

NAPLAN

Students in Grade 3 and Grade 5 only will participate in the NAPLAN Online testing from Wednesday the 13th of March to Thursday the 28th of March 2024.

The National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) assesses literacy and numeracy skills that are essential for every child to progress through school and life. Students participate in the annual NAPLAN tests in reading, writing, language conventions (spelling, grammar, and punctuation) and numeracy.

Please note, only Grade 3 students will complete a handwritten test for Writing and the remaining tests for Grade 3 students are online, while Grade 5 students will complete all tests online.

Safety Outside the School Gates

Medical Updates

Has your child had an update to their medical information? Please bring any new details into the office so we can update our records. For families of students who already have medication on site in our sick bay in case required, we shall be asking parents/carer's to sign a new Medication Authority Form for 2024.

In addition, one of our First Aid Officer's will be contacting families whose medication or Asthma/Anaphylaxis/Allergy plans are due to go out of date in the coming months so new medication or plans can be organized and delivered to the school.

Uniform Shop

We are asking all families to have patience whilst A Plus Schoolwear, our uniform shop, is waiting for new stock to be delivered. We shall inform the school community once this is available for purchase, it is anticipated that it will be supplied in approximately 4 weeks.

For families who have already ordered and paid for items, the uniform shop will deliver these packages to the LNPS office and we shall inform the relevant families when this occurs.

Reminder that our bottle green uniform can continue to be worn for 3 years.




Look out for the reduced speed limit around schools and slow down to improve safety.

School crossings




- · Look out for flags and Crossing Supervisors

Within 10 metres of an intersection




A driver must not stop with any part of their vehicle within 10 metres of an intersection unless signed otherwise.

Yellow edge line




A driver must not stop on the side of a road marked with a yellow edge line.

No parking on nature strips/footpaths



Parking is illegal on nature strips and footpaths.

Stopping across driveways



It is illegal to, stop/park across a driveway unless you stay in the car are there for no more than two minutes and move immediately if required to do so to allow entry or exit by the owner/occupier.

Parking/Stopping signage









No stopping areas must be kept clear. If times/days are specified, restrictions are only applicable to the specified times/days. You cannot park in a P3 minute area for longer than three minutes.

Double parking



It is illegal to double park at any time. This affects the flow of traffic.

3 metre gap for signage



At least 3 metres must be left between your vehicle and the centre dividing line to allow other vehicles to pass safely and not obstruct traffic.

What can you do to stay safe

- · Supervise your children in or near traffic
- · Walk or cycle to school with your child
- Respect all road rules, parking signs and instructions from authorities
- Wait on the same side of the street as your child
- Always let your child out of the kerb side of the car.



Camps, Sports and Excursions fund eligibility (CSEF)

Below are the criteria used to determine a student's eligibility for the Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF).

Criteria 1 – Eligibility

To be eligible* for the fund, a mature minor of sixteen years of age or over, a parent or legal guardian of a student attending a registered Government or non-government Victorian primary or secondary school must:

- · on the first day of Term one, or;
- · on the first day of Term two.
- a) Be an eligible beneficiary within the meaning of the State Concessions Act 2004, that is, be a holder of Veterans Affairs Gold Card or be an eligible Centrelink Health Care Card (HCC) or Pensioner Concession Card (PCC) holder, OR
- b) Be a temporary foster parent, and;
- c) Submit an application to the school by the due date.
- * A special consideration eligibility category also exists. For more information, see: <u>Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF)</u>: <u>Eligibility | education.vic.gov.au</u>

Mature minors or parents who receive a Carer Allowance on behalf of a child, or any other benefit or allowance not income tested by Centrelink, are not eligible for the CSEF unless they also comply with one of (a) or (b) above.

Criteria 2 - Be of school age and attend school in Victoria

School is compulsory for all Victorian children aged between six and seventeen years of age inclusive.

For the purposes of CSEF, students may be eligible for assistance if they attend a Victorian registered primary or secondary school. Typically, these students are aged between five and eighteen years inclusive.

CSEF is not payable to students attending pre-school, kindergarten, home schooling, or TAFE.

Eligibility Date

For concession card holders, CSEF eligibility will be subject to the parent/legal guardian's concession card being successfully validated with Centrelink on 29 January 2024 and/or 15 April 2024.

Payment amounts

CSEF payment amount

The CSEF is an annual payment to the school to be used towards camps, sports and/or excursion expenses for the benefit of the eligible student.

- · Primary school student rate: \$150.00 per year.
- · Secondary school student rate: \$250.00 per year.

The CSEF is paid directly the school and will be allocated by the school towards camps, sports and/or excursion costs for your child.

For ungraded students, the rate payable is determined by the student's date of birth. For more information, see: Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF): Payment amounts | education.vic.gov.au

Foundation and Year 7 government school students who are CSEF recipients are also eligible for a uniform voucher. Schools are required to make applications on behalf of parents, so please register your interest at the school.

How to complete the application form – Application Forms can be collected from the school Office

NOTE: ALL SECTIONS MUST BE COMPLETED BY PARENT/LEGAL GUARDIAN

- 1. Complete the PARENT/LEGAL GUARDIAN DETAILS section.
 - Make sure that the Surname, First Name, and Customer Reference Number (CRN) details match those on your concession card. You will also need to provide your concession card to the school.
 - If you are claiming as a Foster Parent or a Veteran Affairs Pensioner, you will need to provide a copy of documentation confirming your status as a temporary Foster Parent or provide your Veterans Affairs Pensioner Gold card to the school.
- 2. Complete the STUDENT/S DETAILS section for students at this school.
- 3. Sign and date the form and return it to the school office as soon as possible. The CSEF program for 2024 closes at the end of term two


CSEF payments cannot be claimed retrospectively for prior years.
