Parent/Teacher/ Student Interviews



Our Parent/ Teacher/ Student Interviews were held on Thursday the 7th of March. It was wonderful to see over 89% of our families participate in this wonderful opportunity for feedback and to celebrate their child's progress in learning. All families and school staff want the best for children and young people. This was a great opportunity for families and teachers to come together and share important information, as we all work to help our students experience success in learning outcomes.

Our next major opportunity for feedback on progress in learning will be our Semester 1 Reports, however, teachers are always available to make a time to speak to you, if you have any questions or concerns. A quick touch base can often occur at drop off or pick up, but if more time is needed teachers can schedule a time to meet with you or call you.



NAPLAN testing is underway!

This week, Grade 3 and 5 students completed a 'Writing' test on Monday and a 'Reading' test on Thursday. On Friday, it was a catch-up day for any students that missed those first two tests.

Next Monday, Grade 3 and 5 students will sit the online 'Conventions of Language' test and on Tuesday they will complete the 'Numeracy' test.

From Wednesday the 20th of March to Monday the 25th of March catch-up testing is provided for students who were absent on testing days. Please note that the 'Writing' test for Grade 3 is a handwritten test and the last day to sit that catch-up test is next Monday the 18th of March.

Student NAPLAN results for tests completed are generally provided to schools from August onwards, but no exact date is known yet. As soon as we receive the results, we will notify parents and carers via Compass that they are ready for collection from the office.

NAPLAN is only one assessment, and results should be compared to other assessment results to provide a deeper understanding of your child's progress in learning. Parents and carers know their children best, so are aware that they may not perform well under examination conditions, where they must work independently for 40 minutes, stay silent and not ask clarifying questions about problems encountered. Even developing the technology skills needed for online testing can be challenging. This develops with practice and maturity. To support our students, we have 90 new laptops will provide many opportunities in coming years for students to be confident when using technology.

Staff have been really impressed with the efforts our students have put into each test this week.

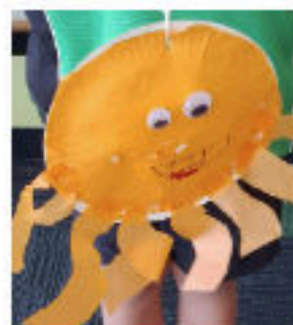
