We have raised a total of **\$2598** from this fundraising event. Many thanks to the families who donated yummy chocolates that contributed to the hampers.

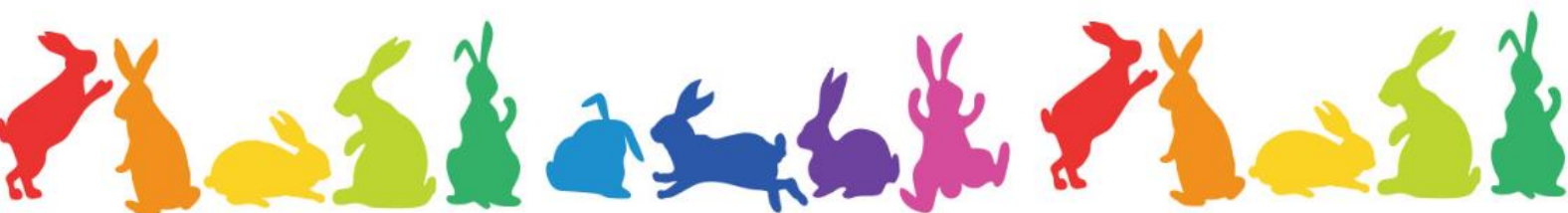


Easter celebrations

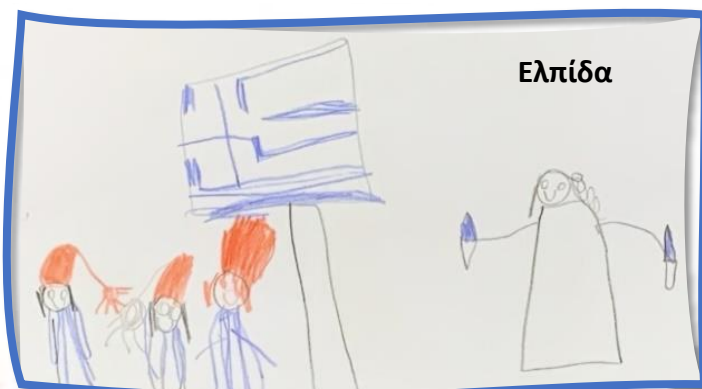

Commemorative In-school Service

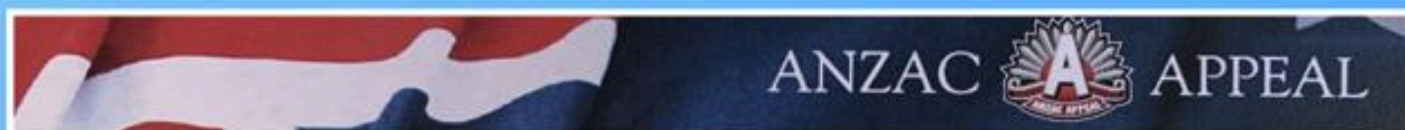

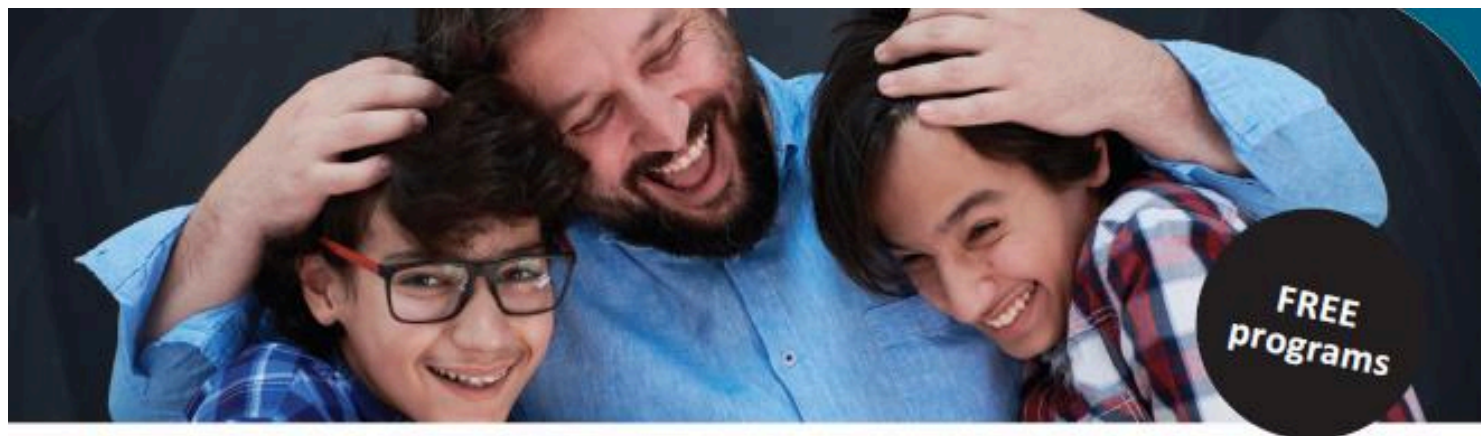

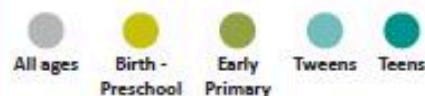
